

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE 2<sup>ND</sup> MEETING OF THE SUB-COMMITTEE FOR  
EVALUATION / SELECTION OF AGENCIES UNDER  
JUTE INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT SCHEME [JIDS]**

In accordance with NJB's letter No. 04/JIDS/MC/Meeting/16-17/861 dated 16.08.2016, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the Sub-Committee for evaluation/selection of agencies under JIDS was held on 19.08.2016 in the O/o the Jute Commissioner.

The meeting was held to select Collaborating Agencies (CA) for operating Jute Integrated Development Scheme. The following Sub-Committee Members/Officials were present :

2. Now in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sub-Committee meeting it is decided that as half year is already getting completed, NJB may perhaps commence the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the Jute Integrated Development Scheme with 50% of the agencies who have qualified representing various states having the highest score in the selection procedure.
3. NJB to enter into an Agreement with MoU with these selected CAs.
4. NJB to ensure availability of the VAT / Sales Tax Registration Certificates, Trade Licences etc. before the execution of the MoU.


5. The CAs shall submit bank guarantee having validity for one year. The amount of bank guarantee may be linked to the advance amount being released to these CAs by NJB in accordance to the Action Plan submitted by the CAs.
6. NJB should ensure that all the Trainees/Master Trainers/Designers under the JIDS shall be linked with Aadhaar numbers and the CAs shall maintain Aadhaar enabled bio-metric systems.
7. The CAs should ensure at least 60% attendance during the training programme and TCPC activities.
8. An undertaking may be obtained from CAs on the selection of trainees certifying that these trainees have not undergone similar training in the past.

The Committee depending on the total marks and coverage of the state has decided to select the following firms as CAs in the 1<sup>st</sup> Phase :


